Monday Feb 23rd Dr Eddy called and brought the book Science & Health. Had quite a long conversation with him. Said I was far in advance of many of Mrs Eddy's students. He seemed a very honest man - but I simply thought he was mistaken, as I could not see how it could be possible, as I knew so little of Christian Science. But afterward I saw what he meant - that I had gotten out of theology.

in her private rooms - ^{being especially invited to do} I had our text book with me
and it met with warm reception. She was charmed

I think it must have been the first time Christian Science was presented in Malone. This was Wednesday May 18th 1880. On our way to Ogdensburg we met a Mr. Wilson who was very much interested in Christian Science - So all the way along the seed was sown from Ogdensburg to Ottawa, Montreal and far away Quebec. Hotel St Louis our stopping place. Christian ^{Science} was now up north - Whether all the seed took root or not I cannot say. Perhaps it was for some one else to fan the sparks into flame.

Sunday June 13th 1880 attended service at 2 Park St. Services seemed very solemn. It was communion and three were taken in to the church.

July 14th 1880 - Sprained ankle - and had to demonstrate myself as there was only God to hear - and God did hear, for it was instantaneous.

Called to Lynn for class. Went with fear that I might be waylaid some way - I was the only one - so remained with Dr. Mrs. Eddy for a long time - It seemed equal to two or three lessons. I took in much - lying in the meantime to cast out.

I am glad to present to The Worcester Church for permanent preservation my reminiscences of Mrs. Eddy and a brief statement of my experience in Christian Science.

I am a native of New London, Connecticut, living there until 1880, when, after a period of much trouble and distress, I removed to Boston for residence.

In January 1880 I attended a Christian Science meeting at Hanthorne Hall, Park Street, at which Mrs. Eddy delivered a sermon.

She opened the discourse by reading the fourth chapter of John and preached from the text

I am the Way the Truth and the Life

I had been advised to attend her lectures at Hanthorne Hall. I went rather reluctantly

but with a longing that I might possibly receive something virtuous unknown, a higher sense of the relationship between God and man, a new knowledge of the Christ way.

The expression "God is our life" had been expressed to me in a way that gave me a strong desire to hear ^{of Mrs. Eddy} & speak, as that seemed to give to me that the Bible must be her guide.

Shall I ever forget that day, or her face as she turned to the audience? I know that she responded to my longing for peace and comfort

under ^{afflictive} difficulties. Her eyes rested upon me in so wonderful a way, that the tears welled up in my own, as if I knew God's messenger stood before me.

She read the 14th chapter of John and her text was "I am the Way the Truth and the Life."

Had she known all the weary way I had come to find this blessed Truth, she could not have spoken with more directness.

With her gaze fixed on me much of the time while speaking I felt her message come directly to me, and that she could see my heart with all its longings and aspirations for good.

Such a discourse I had never heard. It was truly wonderful. As I passed out of the Hall I felt as if I were sailing through air - without weight of body, without apparent supports but above the din and discord of earth and I thought 'Can I ever feel discordant again, no matter what may come to disturb, perplex or annoy?

The air outside as I looked on the tree tops seemed wonderfully harmonious. *Altogether*

I knew not what the matter was to mortal sense, I only felt I could forgive anything of whatever nature. In all these first years I knew from personal experience, and in many ways the wonderful self sacrifice, the patient, watchful care for her child Christian Science, and her loving unselfishness for her students trying to lead them out of bondage into God's marvellous light into "the land of Christian Science where fetters fall" S & H

May God bless all efforts - right efforts to girdle the earth with Truth - and may the response be speedy.

My interest in Christian Science was definitely formed, on that day, and I continued to attend the *Thurston* meetings when in Boston.

In the month of October 1880 I received class instruction from Mrs. Eddy (12 lessons commencing Sept 30th)

My personal recollections of Mrs. Eddy are wonderfully harmonious and pleasant, a loving friend.
